GREETINGS FROM FR. SCOTT

The title of my homily today is "No Guts No Glory." The sons of Zebedee, James and John, wanted to sit beside Jesus in heaven. Jesus told them that if they wanted that, they would have to pay a high price. He basically said, you cannot have the glory of sitting next to me in heaven without a little suffering for others.

Have you ever imagined who might be sitting on the right and left side of Jesus? Will it be a pope? Will it be Gandhi or Abraham Lincoln? Will it be the little lady who gave all she had to the church? One penny!

John and James figured they knew Jesus so they had a good chance to sit beside him. Actually, anyone has a chance to sit next to Jesus. The admission price is being a servant leader. The sons of Zebedee knew nothing about servant leadership. They wanted to be first without paying a price.

At one time in my life, I had visions of being the CEO of some fortune 500 company. There is something human about wanting to be first and the best. But believe me, there is nothing heavenly about that kind of thinking.

Servant leadership has a heavenly goal. It requires us to drink from the cup of suffering. It requires baptism in the river of sacrificial love. To be a servant leader, there is no resurrection without the cross. Put another way, there is no gain without the pain. Isaiah tells us in that first reading, "Through his suffering he will defend many."

Jesus is our example of servant leadership. Throughout his three year ministry, he was not a dictator. He was a servant. He respected and supported his people. He taught those who wanted to listen. He cared for those who had special needs. Jesus would literally stop to listen to a woman's medical history while on a mercy dash to save a dying girl.

Being a servant leader today is committing to the welfare of others by going that extra mile to help them. Servant leadership demands much of the disciple: taking time to know what your spouse likes and needs; listening to elderly people's stories, hopes, and fears; offering to help co-workers in their tasks; waiting patiently for children to learn a skill you already know; caring for a friend when they are depressed and supporting them when they face some trauma.

We would all like to sit at the right side of Jesus. Here are some ways we might make that possible. Confront injustice. Defend the rights of the poor. Forgive others. Reconcile problems with your family and friends. That is our admission to the best seat in the house!

Are you willing to go that extra mile to make another person happy? We are being called today to be servant leaders. As we serve others, we become more open to learn and receive from Jesus. Jesus said, "Whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant."
