-- Would you like me to call this girl that I know? She'd be more than happy to come.

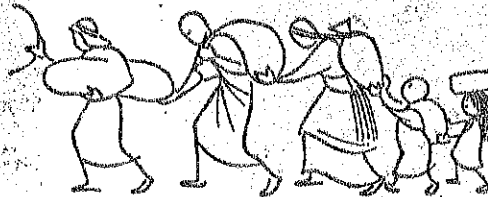
So I called Debbie and the two decided to get together.

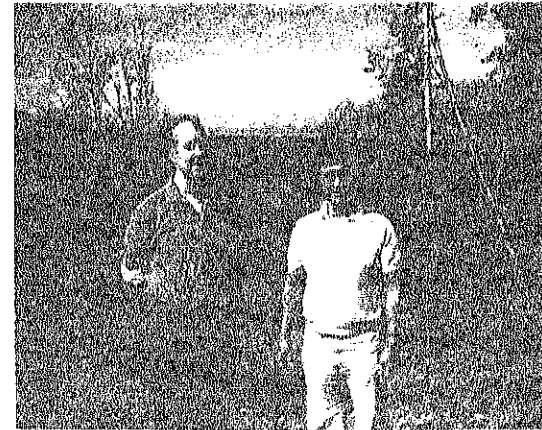
