Lenten Obligation to Personal Self-Sacrifice

We Catholics during the season of Lent are called by the Church to perform acts of personal self-sacrifice. Such sacrifice is a sign of our identity with the suffering of Christ, which brought our redemption.

The obligation is serious, in keeping with the urging of Jesus: "Unless you do penance (self-sacrifice), you shall likewise perish."

For your assistance during this season of Lent the following Guidelines are offered:

Lenten Guideline No. 1: Ask yourself the correct question! The correct question is: What act of self-sacrifice would be really significant for me? The answer to this question each day will help you to compare your sacrifice with the suffering of Christ.

Lenten Guideline No. 2: Give special attention to the kind and types of self-sacrifice suggested by the Bishops of the country:

Ash Wednesday: Fast and Abstinence

All Fridays of Lent: Abstinence

Good Friday: Fast and Abstinence

Abstinence is simply no meat. Fast is only one full meal a day, two small collations, nothing in between. In keeping with Guideline No. 1, the intensity and extent of the fast should be measured by one's age, health and capability. Observance of these special days will be a sign of unity among Catholics in the United States.

Lenten Guideline No. 3: Do not ask the wrong question! The wrong question begins: "Is it a sin...?" One should approach the obligation to self-sacrifice not in terms of sin, which suggests getting by with as little as possible, but rather the approach should be in terms of love of God and imitating the sufferings of Christ, which suggests generosity of spirit.

Lenten Guideline No. 4: At the end of Lent ask yourself the question: How generous was I towards God? You should judge yourself not so much by individual successes or failures, but by the overall pattern you followed.
